Deuce	shows that there will be some unfortunate opposition to your favourite inclination, which will much disturb you.	shows that extraordinary success and good fortune will attend this person; though if unfavourable cards attend, this will be a long time delayed.	always signifies a coffin, but who it is for must depend entirely on the cards that are near it.	denotes that your heart will be engaged in love at an early period; that your friends will not approve your choice; and that if you marry without their consent they will hardly forgive you.
Trey	shows that you will be three times married, and each time to a wealthy person.	shows that your own imprudence will greatly contribute to your experiencing the ill will of others.	shows that you will be unfortunate in marriage, that your partner will be inconstant, and that you will be made unhappy.	denotes that you will be engaged in quarrels, lawsuits, and domestic disagreements; your partner for life will be a vixen, and fail in the performance of her nuptial duties, and make you unhappy.
